THE MFS TAKE TO THE WATER IN SEARCH OF GOLD

The World Police and Fire Games were brought to the Yorke Peninsula this week with beach and boat divisions of the angling.

In the boat section the MFS had five competitors with Station Officer Ted Robinson snatching gold for heaviest whiting.

Firefighter Paul Rayner managed to continue the winning form taking gold for catching one of the target fish and Moonta Station Officer John Osborn also won gold for heaviest snapper.

The South Australian Metropolitan Fire Service was well represented in the Beach competition with team captain Mark Searcy and retired firefighter Paul Caica MP forming a formidable duo.

Paul and Mark's total winning catchweight was an impressive eight kilograms with second place weighing in at two kilograms.

As well as winning the gold in the duos, the Member for Colton, Paul Caica won gold in the individual heaviest bag with Mark Searcy taking the silver.

Mark Searcy says he is, "happy to get the gold" in the teams event after taking silver in the last Games in Quebec.
